Would create the Wildland Fire Response Act and the place the Wildland Incident Response Assistance Team (WIRAT) within the administration of the State Fire Marshal. The WIRAT would be authorized to provide assistance or guidance to any individual or entity attempting to prevent, control, suppress, or otherwise mitigate wildland fire as determined by the State Fire Marshal or his or her designee. The Adjutant General and NEMA would provide assistance to the WIRAT upon an emergency declaration by the Governor. The State Fire Marshal would consult with the State Forster in selecting squad leaders and squad members from among employees of the State Fire Marshal and the Nebraska Forest service. The State Forest Service and the Office of The State Fire Marshal are responsible for compensating each of the employees while serving on the WIRAT and each of the offices.

However, for Open Meetings Act, until January 1, 2024, in case of refusal, neglect, or inability of newspaper to time published the notice, public body shall (a) post notice on its website, if available, and (b) post such notice in conspicuous public place in such public body, jurisdiction. Public body required to keep a written record of such posting. The record of posting shall be evidence that such posting was done as required and shall be sufficient to fulfill the requirement of publication. Beginning January 1, 2024, advanced reasonable publicized notice shall be given by (a)(i) publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body jurisdiction, that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of meeting; (ii) posting on such newspaper website if available, and (iii) posting on statewide website established and maintained by a repository for such notices by majority of Nebraska newspapers. Such notice shall be placed in the newspaper and on websites by the newspaper; or (b)(i) posting to newspapers website if available, and (ii) a statewide website to establish and maintain a repository for such notices by majority of Nebraska newspapers. As new edition of the newspaper of general circulation within the body's jurisdiction is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting. In the case of the governing body of the city of the second class or village, such notice shall be given by (a)(i) publication in a newspaper of general circulation within the public body, jurisdiction that is finalized for printing prior to the time and date of the meeting, (ii) posting on such newspaper's website if available, and (iii) posting a statewide website established as described above; (b)(i) posting on newspapers website if available, and (ii) on a statewide website establish and maintain, as described above; or (c)(i) posting written notice and three conspicuous public places in such city or village and such notices shall be posted by the public body in the same three places for each meeting.

Would create the Newborn Safe Haven Act by establishing locations, procedures and authorized personnel to receive from parent or authorized person surrender of physical custody of the newborn infant who is or appears to be 90 days old or younger for the voluntary release custody of the newborn infant. Custody can be surrendered to medical staff at the hospital or healthcare facility displaying a decal or placard as described in the ac and TO A FIRE STATION OR EMERGENCY MEDICAL PROVIDER LOCATION WHICH IS STAFFED 24 HOURS PER DAY, SEVEN DAYS PER WEEK and there is a receptacle located in an area conspicuous and visible to staff or the receptacles located in an area that is not visible to staff but is equipped with a motion sensor and dual alarm system which is programmed to sound first when the receptacle is opened, immediately placing a telephone call to a 911 service and dispatching emergency medical care provider or firefighter to the location of the receptacle and, sound a second time, immediately placing a telephone call to a 911 service after movement is detected inside the receptacle. WOULD ALSO ALLOW SURRENDER PHYSICAL CUSTODY OF NEWBORN INFANT BY TELEPHONING 911 SERVICE AND SURRENDER PHYSICAL CUSTODY OF THE NEWBORN INFANT TO AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL SERVICE PROVIDER RESPONDING TO SUCH 911 TELEPHONE CALL. Would establish a rebuttable presumption that the person surrendering physical custody is the newborn infant's parent or has surrendered custody with the parent's authorization. The person taking physical custody of the individual on duty of an approved drop-off location shall make a reasonable attempt to obtain information from the parent as outlined in the bill. The receiving person at a drop off location other than a hospital or emergency medical services provider shall contact 911 service to have an emergency medical service provider transport the newborn infant nurse hospital. Requirement to contact the Department of Health and Human Services as soon as possible after receipt of newborn infant. Provisions for training and funding for training Person taking custody immune from criminal or civil liability for any acts or omissions made in good faith to comply with requirements of the act.
